### BUILDING WORK UPDATE: HALL

The demolition crew have removed the floor and stumps. Main cables from the church and the parish office were found under the hall floor. We have received and accepted a quote from the builders for the electrical works that need to be completed. These cables need to re-located which may take up to a week to complete. This has already caused two week's delay in works! The plumbers also need to re-locate the gas pipes for the heaters (before the concrete). The hall floor can then be excavated (200mm-350mm of soil removed) and concrete poured.

### THE STEPUP GROU

*This Group has now been operating for a couple of months and we should acknowledge the hard work and dedication of the presenters and trainers within this group. They have amazing talent and have used their knowledge to teach people how to increase their job seeking skills. We have had some successes in placing people in contact with employers and with their new skills, I am sure that they will continue on to securing suitable employment.*

*We will be running another workshop commencing at 9.00am on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> September 2011 and it should run for about 90 minutes. The purpose of these workshops is to look at how we can boost your chances of getting to an interview and then onto getting that job!*

*Here are some of the things that we look at during our workshops:-*

*Resumes - Your resume is probably one of the first things that a prospective employer looks at and it should give them a good idea of your background and what you are capable of*

*Interviews - What you say or not say during an interview? The interview will tell your prospective employer how well you communicate and therefore how well you will fit into the team environment*

*Presentation - What you wear is as important as what you say.*

*Role Plays - We can conduct mock interviews so that is easier for you when you get to the real interview and doesn't seem so daunting.*

*We also have a file of prospective employers but we need lots more so that we can match people with the right skills to the right employer. Before we can put you in contact with that employer, we first have to see you at our workshops so that you are the best prepared that you can be..... so book in now so you don't miss out! We can always use more contacts, so if you know of any jobs that are available let us know. It doesn't matter if the job is full time, part time or casual just let us know because chances are that we have someone waiting for it.*

*It is also that time of year when the youth of our parish are looking for jobs either on full time or part time basis coming out of VCE studies. We need to encourage them to come along to one of the workshops and we can prepare them so that they also benefit.....do you remember what it was like at your first interview? That's why they need preparation! We look forward to hearing from you and seeing you at our next workshop because there is always room for more!*

### Reading 2

Phil 2:1-11

Brothers and sisters:  
If there is any encouragement in Christ,

united in heart, thinking one thing.  
Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory;  
rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves,

but afterwards changed his mind and went.  
The man came to the other son and gave the same order.  
He said in reply, 'Yes, sir, 'but did not go.  
Which of the two did his father's will?"  
They answered, "The first."  
Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you,  
tax collectors and prostitutes  
are entering the kingdom of God before you.  
When John came to you in the way of righteousness,  
you did not believe him;  
but tax collectors and prostitutes did.  
Yet even when you saw that,  
you did not later change your minds and believe him."
