BUILDING WORKS UPDATE

Over the past 4 weeks the architect, soil engineer and structural engineer have been liaising about the slab floor. The initial specifications were for 500 ton of crushed rock to be used as a base. After much deliberation between the three parties they finally reached a consensus (this is why no work has been able to be done during the last 4 weeks). One positive outcome was a saving of \$16,000 because of this change. The plans are now back at council as there is a change to the permit issued. All going well works should recommence next week.

Mal 1:14B-2:2B, 8-10

A great King am I, says the LORD of hosts,
